

About the Japan Pavilion and Garden at GREEN×EXPO 2027

Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism / Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries

- At GREEN×EXPO 2027, the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism and the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries will jointly present the Japan Pavilion and Garden. Details are currently under consideration through meetings and discussions with experts.
- Under the concept of “Reconsidering the Japanese View of Nature, Moving Toward the Future,” the Japan Pavilion and Garden will make use of the natural conditions of the site at the headwaters of the Izumi River. Based on the idea of teioku ichinyo, in which garden and architecture are integrated as one, the indoor and outdoor exhibitions will be designed as a unified experience.
- The Japan Pavilion and Garden will occupy approximately 2.5 hectares, the largest exhibition area within the venue. The building area will be approximately 3,700 square meters.

- The Japan Pavilion and Garden will express the Japanese view of nature, culture and art, and satoyama landscapes that have been passed down through generations in Japan. This will be achieved through wooden buildings divided into east and west structures, a garden incorporating traditional Japanese garden techniques, and actual exhibits such as ikebana and bonsai.
- The exhibition will also communicate green infrastructure, smart agriculture, and related initiatives in order to reaffirm the functions and roles of greenery and propose approaches to addressing global-scale challenges.
